President's Message

L'Shanah Tovah. First let me say what a joy it was to see so many people in our sanctuary, congregants and guests, on Rosh Hashanah morning. This was Rabbi Danielle's first holiday service with us, and she was thrilled to meet and greet so many people. It would be wonderful if our sanctuary could be filled like that whenever we have an inperson Shabbat service. I hope you will consider coming to services, and bring a friend or two.

Rosh Hashanah calls on us to reflect on how we've lived in the past year and how we will live in the year to come. I am going to quote an email I received from Jewish Federation of Northern New Jersey which says it best:

"As 5786 begins, let's lean into a few simple, meaningful ways to sweeten daily life and strengthen our community. This year, let's:

- **Be present**: slow down, make eye contact, savor the moment.
- Do more good: one mitzvah at a time—check on a neighbor, deliver a meal, lend a hand.
- **Do more 'Jewish'**—volunteer Jewish, donate Jewish, celebrate Jewish, learn Jewish—if we don't--who will?
- **Schmooze more**: call your parents, text the grandkids, reconnect with old friends.
- Live well—move your body, get a good night's sleep, choose foods that help you feel your best.
- **Keep your word**—less procrastinating; more 'I said I would, and I did.'
- **Show up**—volunteer, join a drive, and support initiatives that make the Jewish community stronger.

When we do these small things, we become a little more **mensch**-like and give one another reasons to **kvell**."

This is also the time of year when we turn to you to fulfill one of the most sacred obligations as Jews...tzedakah. Please pay your dues, send cards through our tribute fund, remember a yahrzeit of a loved one, and most important, make a High Holy Day donation. Temple Beth Am relies on these donations which help to sustain our congregation.

Let me take this opportunity to thank the people who keep Temple Beth Am going: Rabbi Danielle Leshaw, who leads us in prayer every Shabbat morning and instructs us in the teachings of Torah in the Tuesday class; Cantorial soloist Sherry Kosinski, whose beautiful voice enhances our services; Sue Shapiro who puts together our bulletin, pays the bills, writes out the tributes, among a myriad of other things; Murray Blackstone and Jeff Shapiro who keep the building in good shape and are there to solve any physical problems; and Sue Miller who writes out the Yahrzeit notices and does my paperwork for me because of my poor eyesight.

Finally, let us remember that we are coming up on the second anniversary of October 7th. In your prayers this holiday season, please include the hostages and their grief-stricken families, and pray for their release and peace in Israel.


